National Human Trafficking Resource Center: Polaris Project www.polarisproject.org

• A nonprofit, non-governmental organization that works to combat and prevent modernday slavery and human trafficking. The organization works directly with victims, hosts tip and crisis hotlines, and offers solutions to those victimized by human trafficking.

National Human Trafficking Hotline 1-888-373-7888

• A national, toll-free hotline, available to answer calls from anywhere in the United States, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, in more than 200 languages. The Hotline's mission is to connect human trafficking victims and survivors to critical support and services to get help and stay safe. It also equips the anti-trafficking community with the tools to effectively combat all forms of human trafficking. The Hotline offers around-the-clock access to a safe space to report tips, seek services, and ask for help.

Text 'BeFree' to 233733

- Polaris also independently operates the BeFree Textline. Victims and survivors may send a message to BeFree (233733) to get help or to connect with local services.
- The BeFree Textline offers confidential crisis assistance and support, referrals, tip reporting, and general information about human trafficking through SMS text message. Textline advocates are available to respond Monday-Sunday from 3-11pm EST.

- Established in 2011, NCMEC's Child Sex Trafficking Team (CSTT) provides specialized technical assistance, analysis and recovery services on cases involving child sex trafficking, including:
 - Reviewing CyberTipline reports relating to child sex trafficking;
 - Assisting on cases of missing children involved in, or at risk of, trafficking; and
 - Providing technical assistance and training to help with the identification, location and provision of recovery planning to victims of child sex trafficking.
- NCMEC provides "Hope Bags" which contain basic necessities such as toiletries, shoes, snacks and a change of clothes that can be given to recovered victims.
- Through the Family Advocacy Division the NCMEC offers support services to families experiencing trauma when a child is missing or sexually exploited and offers expert guidance about how families can move forward. The Family Advocacy Division's

family-centered approach helps create a collaborative environment to assist families identify areas of need and find the right community-based resources to address those needs.

• Serving all of Hampton Roads, Seton Youth Shelters provides 24-hour emergency shelter for youth ages 9-17 years old and in special cases for 18 year olds. This program serves

runaway/homeless youth and youth in crisis within their family, school and/or community. Seton Youth Shelters operates two shelters in Virginia Beach, one for boys and the other for girls.

- Residents are provided with case management to facilitate coordination of services.
 Residents also receive youth advocacy and individual/family crisis counseling,
 community referrals and aftercare follow-up. Youth who enter the shelter program attend local public schools. Residents will also be offered counseling services that address a variety of topics and serve to increase youth awareness of community resources.

- NOVA HTI works directly with law enforcement to assess and coordinate all aspects of care for human trafficking survivors and provide the healthy support structure needed for them to thrive.
 - Mentors stand-with trafficking survivors, helping them through their challenges and celebrating their triumphs.
 - Volunteer floaters provide a variety of services for clients. For example, a volunteer floater may be asked to drive clients to appointments, gather/deliver supplies, teach life skills, or assist with emails or phone calls.
 - Crisis response team members are those called at any time day or night to recovery scenes and work with law enforcement to provide the immediate needs of victims.

- Case management team members partner with law enforcement as they assess the individual needs of the client, write an individualized plan of care with the client, and refer them to the appropriate treatment facilities and service providers.
- Family Life Transition is a program where families open their homes to provide housing to stable survivors who are ready for that transition. Training, backgrounds screenings, references and interviews are required.

 - Symptoms
 - Any treatments you already tried
 - The patient's medical history

•	The Virginia Poison Control Center serves as a 24/7 resource for physicians, emergency medical personnel and other health care professionals by providing the most current information on assessment and treatment of toxic exposures.
•	In the event of a rare poisoning, a patient with significant toxicity or unusual presentations, this service is available 24/7 for a phone consultation with one of the four toxicologists, who are all fellowship trained and board eligible/certified in clinical or medical toxicology.
