Course description

The Palliative Care Symposium is designed for health care professionals caring for patients with life-limiting illnesses and/or in need of palliative care, as well as their families. Presentation topics will include: communication related to serious illness, managing nonpain symptoms, utilization of telehealth interventions, bereavement support, and resiliency for health care professionals.

Target audience

Course objectives

At the conclusion of this activity, learners will be able to:

- Identify symptoms and proper treatment for patients with progressive illness.
- Promote the appropriate and effective use of telehealth technology in providing patient care.
- Explain the importance of assessing and considering code status with patients prior to surgery.
- Discuss interprofessional collaboration in managing serious illness based on care model case studies.
